TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Cast nets are permitted for catching bait. Landing nets are permitted.
2. Rod, reel, canepole and handline fishing only. No spears, harpoons, nets, snag hooks or gigs. Anglers may fish from shore, pier, beach, bridge, catwalk, dock, canoe, kayak, private boats, charter boats and party boats. All fishing expenses are in addition to applicable tournament entry fee.
3. You may fish anywhere, but must be at the Crandon Park Marina by 3 p.m. with your score chart and/or fish.
4. Every participant shall be responsible for compliance with all County, State and Federal laws that may apply.
5. Eligible species are listed in the Anglers' Score Chart. An eligible fish must be a minimum of 10 inches long from tip of nose to fork/center of tail, whichever is longer. Eligible species must be caught on the day of the tournament.
6. This is a catch-and-release tournament except for fish that may be kept for Heaviest Fish Division and personal consumption; or, for IGFA record consideration.
7. Points will be awarded as per scoring chart.
8. All participants are strongly encouraged to attend the Captains' and Anglers' meeting on Friday, April 1 (No Joke!) at the MAST cafeteria. Doors open at 6:30 p.m. Meeting starts at 6:45 p.m. Registrations will be accepted. There will be refreshments, handouts, giveaways, rules discussion, contact information for during the tournament, species identification, prize lists and displays, introductions and fellowship. Meeting should end by 8 p.m.
9. Each team shall submit an application along with the entry fee. Team entry fees cover the individual entry fees for team members. Individual anglers shall submit an application. Those anglers not part of a team shall pay the individual angler's entry fee, but they may join other individual anglers to form a team at any time before the tournament begins at 6:10 a.m. Saturday. If individuals have paid their own entry fees, there is no additional team entry fee.
10. Every angler may enter as an individual and as a member of a team. Teams shall consist of up to five members. Family teams are not limited in size, but the team prize will be for a maximum of five people.
11. Each angler who is a MAST student will have his/her points included in his/her class total. The class with the most points will be awarded a trophy, to be passed on to the next winning class each year.
12. All prizes will be awarded.
13. Rules of the tournament may be changed to accommodate entries, conditions and prizes.
14. Decision of the judges will be final.
15. Heaviest fish must be weighed at Crandon Marina by the judges. No estimates will be accepted for award consideration. Species eligible for heaviest fish are denoted on the scoring chart with an "*".
16. Honor system as to species identification, number landed, and size. All entrants upon submitting their Anglers' and Team Score Charts at end of tournament will be asked to sign a statement swearing or affirming that the information provided is truthful and accurate. Pictures of your catch are encouraged.
17. You do not need to report anywhere to start fishing the morning of April 2. Lines in at 6:10 a.m. - sunrise. All anglers must be at Crandon Marina by 3 p.m. to submit their Anglers' and Team Score Charts. Every member of a team must submit an Angler's Score Chart, and the team must submit a Team Score Chart to have their catches registered for award consideration. Winners will be announced and awards made at MAST pool deck barbecue.
18. Same fish can be entered for both Point Division and Heaviest Fish Division.
19. Each angler and team shall tally his or her points earned before signing the Score Chart and submitting to the judges.
20. MAST/PTSA does not provide any transportation nor any boat accommodations.
21. Consumption of alcohol while participating in the tournament and on school property is prohibited.
22. You are encouraged to know and comply with water safety rules.
23. MAST PTSA Fishing Tournament is open to anyone.

It is expressly understood and agreed that, in consideration of the privilege of entering this event, all participants in this tournament enter at their own risk, and that the MAST Academy PTSA, its officers and directors and all persons connected directly or indirectly with the operation of said tournament, shall be released from any liability for libel, slander, loss, damage, negligence, harm, injury or death suffered by any participant, entrant, sportsfisherman, his companions, boat captains, mates, crew members, vessels and equipment which may occur during the tournament. This constitutes a total and complete release of any and all negligence, liability or potential liability for any actions, omissions, or inaction by, or on behalf of, the MAST PTSA, its officers, directors or other persons connected with the operation of this tournament.
